Background:

On June 23, 2015, the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners adopted Ordinance 2015-25 entitled the "Palm Beach County Solicitation and Distribution on Public Roads Ordinance", commonly known as the Panhandling Ordinance. This Ordinance, codified in Section 18-7 of the Palm Beach County Code, prohibits people from being upon a State or County road for the purpose of displaying information, distributing materials, or soliciting charitable contributions and was enacted due to the danger of these activities in the roadway. The Ordinance is effective in all of unincorporated Palm Beach County and in municipalities that choose to have it effective in their jurisdiction.

On August 10, 2015, the City Council voted to contract with the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO) to provide law enforcement services within the City of Greenacres. The PBSO Captain overseeing the provision of services in Greenacres has requested that Greenacres "opt-in" so that these regulations will apply uniformly within the City and adjacent unincorporated areas. The City Council approved this proposed Ordinance on first reading February 22, 2016 by a unanimous vote of 5-0.

Analysis:

By "opting-in" to the County Ordinance, these important safety and quality of life regulations can be enforced seamlessly around the City. In addition, the County Ordinance was developed after significant effort and with input from various stakeholders. It would be inefficient for City staff to undertake crafting our own City Ordinance on the same subject.

Legal:

The Ordinance was prepared in accord with the Florida Statutes and City Code requirements.

Financial:

Staff Recommendation:

Adoption of Ordinance 2016-12 opting-in to the Countywide Panhandling Ordinance contained in Section 18-7 of the County Code.
