ZIP CORRECTLY & SAVE MONEY!

The City of Greenacres has five United States Postal Zip Codes. The mail in these zip codes is processed in three (3) post offices (Greenacres, Lake Worth and West Palm Beach), and delivered to the residents and businesses in Greenacres.

Zip Code boundaries do not conform to city boundaries and the name of the post office does not correspond to city names. For example, the West Palm Beach and Lake Worth post offices are not located in either of those cities. They are located in unincorporated Palm Beach County. Therefore, do not confuse the zip code name with the name of the city in which you live.

A letter from the Postmaster to Mayor Ferreri states, "In an effort to identify residents/businesses of the City of Greenacres, the preferred City name of Greenacres should be used with the correct 5-digit Zip Code to ensure that their mail is sent to the correct post office for delivery."

Using a City name other than Greenacres affects you in the following ways:

- ❖ When purchasing or renewing homeowners and automobile insurance, your agent collects a surcharge that is sent to the State of Florida. This surcharge is then remitted to the City in which you live to fund Police Officers and Firefighters Pensions. If your insurance agent does not use the city name of Greenacres as part of your address on the policy, and City Code 416, the funds will be remitted to other cities. If this happens, the City may have to increase taxes in order to compensate for the diverted Pension funds.
- ❖ A component of the property insurance premium you pay is based on the Insurance Services Office (ISO) classification of the Fire Suppression delivery system of the community in which you reside. The classification ranges between one (1) and ten (10) with one (1) being the best. The City of Greenacres has an ISO Classification of three (3), which is a superior rating compared to the communities surrounding the City. Out of 801 communities in the State of Florida, only 46 have an ISO class of three (3) like the City of Greenacres. Out of the 38 communities in Palm Beach County only seven (7) have a classification three (3) or better.

Using the City name of Greenacres along with the proper zip codes of 33463, 33467, 33413, 33415, and 33454 will:

- ❖ Lower your Property Insurance
- ❖ Ensure the funding of your City's Police and Fire retirement plans
- ❖ Ensure proper delivery of your mail

CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVEMENT FOR EXCELLENCE IN FINANCIAL REPORTING AWARD

The City of Greenacres was awarded the Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting by the Government Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada (GFOA) for its comprehensive annual financial report (CAFR). The Certificate of Achievement is the highest form of recognition in the area of governmental accounting and financial reporting, and its attainment represents a significant accomplishment by a government and its management. The CAFR has been judged by an impartial panel to meet the high standards of the program including demonstrating a constructive “spirit of full disclosure” to clearly communicate its financial story and motivate potential users and user groups to read the CAFR.

The City of Greenacres is honored by the attainment of this distinguished award for its’ fourteenth (14th) consecutive year.

HURRICANE PROTECTION AND WINDOW FILM

Recently the Building Department has received several inquiries regarding the use of window film as a form of hurricane protection. Although window film does have its uses, there is no window film that provides “approved hurricane protection,” there is no window film that performs as an “alternative to hurricane shutters,” and there is no window film that meets the large missile impact test in accordance with the Florida Building Code.

There are various types of window film that serve useful functions. There are window films that provide energy-saving solar control, window films that provide UV protection, decorative window films, and safety/security films. The latter is intended to provide a level of protection against easy entry by criminals, or to hold glass fragments together in the event of an explosion, or to provide protection in hazardous locations where a person could easily walk into the glass.

All new glass openings are to be protected, and the products must



be tested and approved per Section 1609.1.4 of the 2004 Florida Building Code. Windows and doors with windows must be impact resistant (such as laminated glass) or be protected with an impact resistant covering (such as shutters or other approved product). At this time no window film meets this requirement for areas up to 30 feet above ground, and all the windows in the City of Greenacres are within 30 feet of the ground.

HOUSING REHAB PROGRAM

In the continuing effort to improve services and meet the needs of the community, the City offers an Emergency Rehabilitation program in conjunction with Palm Beach County Housing and Community Development. Emergency rehabs carry a maximum funding limit of \$8,000 and may include items such as the recovering of a roof that is leaking, the replacement of doors and windows that are broken, the upgrading of unsafe or substandard electrical services, the replacement of septic tanks or drain fields that are not functioning correctly, etc.

The program is available to anyone who owns and lives in his or her own home, and anyone who is not financially able to make the repairs. In order to determine eligibility for participation in the program, the homeowner must complete an application and then be personally interviewed. The homeowner's annual income must fall within certain broad limits; for



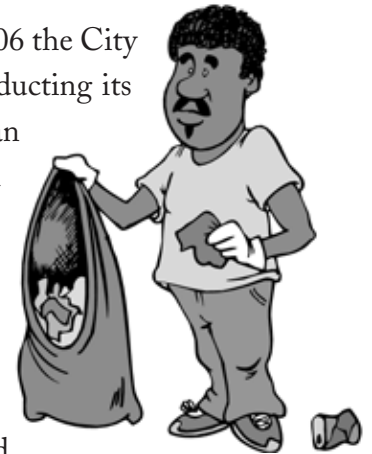
example, a two-person household may have total annual income as high as \$40,200. This amount varies depending upon the number of persons in the household.

At the interview, a great deal of information must be provided, and all is held in the strictest of confidence. Here are a few examples of what is required: social security numbers for all household members, drivers licenses or other picture ID for all adult household members, proof of total income such as child support, social security, pensions, unemployment compensation, etc., IRS returns for the previous two years, information on loans and charge accounts, etc.

OPERATION RED LIGHTS AT NIGHT

A new traffic detail was implemented during the first month of the New Year in an effort to meet one of Uniform Patrol's 2006 goals and objectives for traffic safety, education, and enforcement. This detail named "Operation Red Lights At Night," focuses on red light violations during the nighttime hours. Operation Red Lights At Night was conducted January 3rd – 6th and January 11-14th, and netted the following results:

WHAT TO DO ABOUT IDENTITY THEFT

Even though you may take precautions to ensure that your personal identity and information is safe, you could still be the victim of identity theft. Below are some steps to take if you do become a victim.

1. Report the case to your local law enforcement agency and obtain a case number. The report can be filed in the city or county in which you reside, or the location where the offense occurred. When available, obtain a copy of the report.
2. Notify the three major credit bureaus. Order

copies of your credit report. You can also have a fraud alert placed on your credit report. Request that creditors contact you prior to opening new accounts or making changes to any of your accounts.

3. Contact the fraud department of each of your creditors. You may be requested to complete an affidavit disputing the fraud. Confirm all conversations in writing and keep copies of all documentation.
4. Contact your banking institution. If you believe that your account has been compromised, close your checking and savings accounts and obtain new account numbers. Stop payment on any stolen checks.
5. Contact the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (DHSMV) and have a flag placed on your driver's license. If your personal information was actually used to secure a driver's license, DHSMV will conduct an investigation.

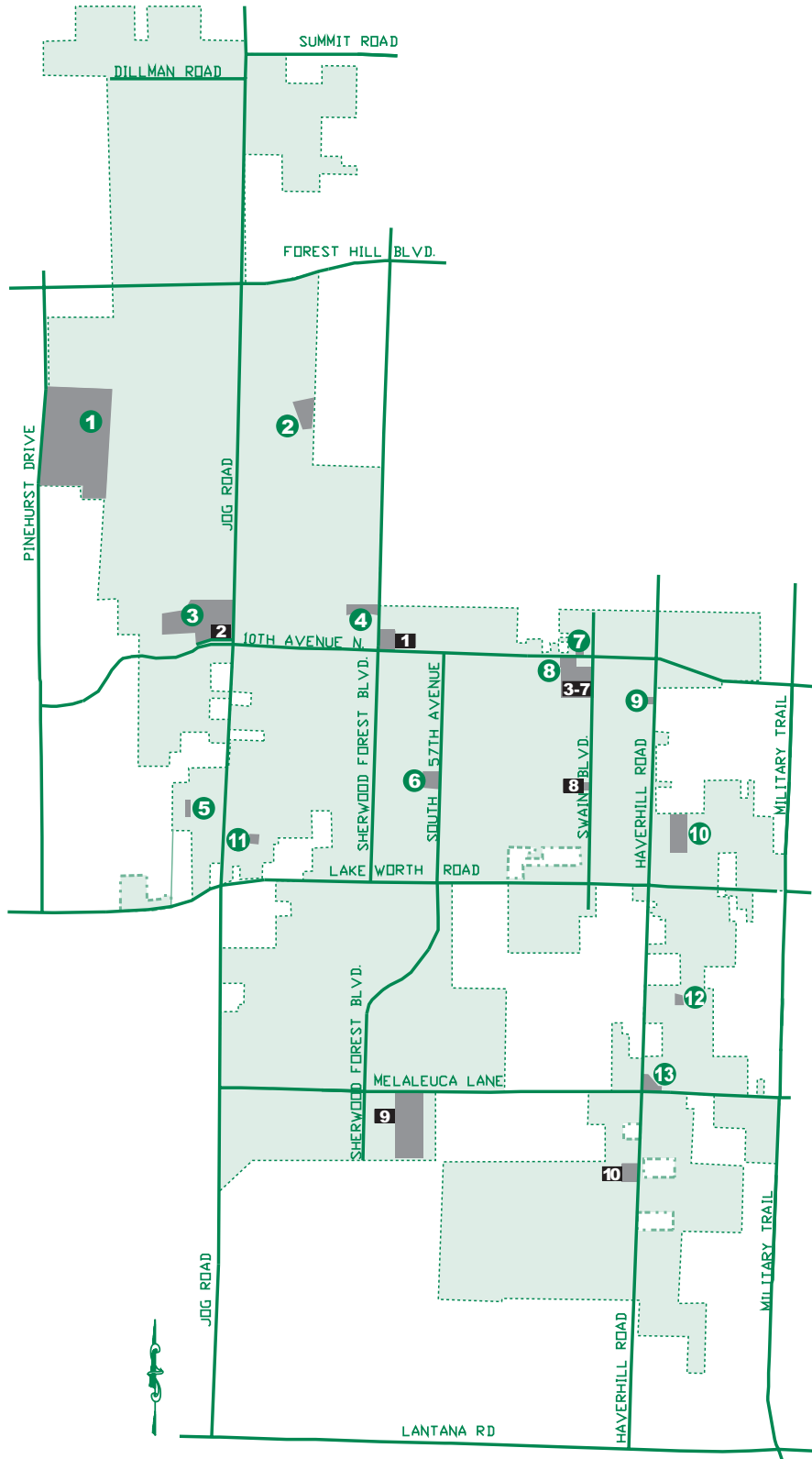
