## Celebrating 90 Years...

During the real estate boom of the 1920's, Lawrence Carter Swain (1864-1944) accumulated 320 acres to create a community for the working class. He platted half the townsite in 1925, setting aside ten acres for county school and town use. Plat 2, one-half mile west of Military Trail, became the Original Section of our City. Swain began selling lots in 1925 for \$225, with \$45 down. By the time the Town of Greenacres City was incorporated in 1926, the population was about 1,250, and Swain moved his family down from Massachusetts.

Ten months after Swain's death in 1944, about 125 residents successfully petitioned the Florida Legislature to annul the City Charter. When soldiers returned from World War II months later, they fought the decision in court; Greenacres' rights as a City were reinstated in December 1945 and it was officially reincorporated in 1947. L. C. Swain Middle School and Swain Boulevard are named for our founder.

The City of Greenacres (renamed in 1990) now covers about six (6) square miles through annexation, and is the eighth largest of the 38 municipalities in Palm Beach County. The City is governed by a mayor and five (5) council members who establish policy for the City while the daily operations are administered by a city manager. The City provides a complement of municipal services including Public Safety (Police, Fire, and Emergency Medical Services), Parks and Recreation, Planning, Building, Engineering, and Public Works.

For many years the National Arbor Day Foundation has named the City of Greenacres a "Tree City USA." In 2007 through 2012 Greenacres was recognized as one of the "100 Best Communities for Young People" in the U.S. by America's Promise-The Alliance for Youth.

Today, Greenacres is recognized as a safe, attractive, well-maintained and financially stable community that is a "A Great Place to Be".

## Council Actions

The following are highlights of actions taken by the City Council at their meetings from July through December, 2015.

- Approved an agreement with the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office to provide Law Enforcement services in the City, effective February 1, 2016.
- Established a taxable valuation and levied an ad valorem tax on property located within the corporate limits for the year ending December 31, 2015, and adopted an operating budget for FY 2015 beginning October 1, 2015 and ending September 30, 2016.
- Appointed James D. Stokes as the City Attorney.
- Authorized changing the date of the March 2016 Municipal Election to coincide with the statewide Presidential Preference Primary being held on March 15, 2016.
- Amended Chapter 7 of the City of Greenacres Code of Ordinances, to allow for a Mortgage Foreclosure Registration process and approved an Agreement between the City of Greenacres and Community Champions Corporation for providing those services.
- Award of Bid No. 15-002 to Sisca Construction Services, LLC, for the Community Center Expansion Project.
- Site Plan approval for Greenacres Nissan Motor Vehicle Dealership located at 5385 Lake Worth Road.
- Authorized the sale of property described at 364 Swain Boulevard to the Greenacres American Legion, Inc., Post No. 258.
- Authorized the FY 2016 contract with the Florida Department of Corrections to provide work squads to the City.
- Authorized an Agreement with the Lake Worth Sharks for the Department of Leisure Services' Co-ed Youth Soccer League.
- Authorized a budget adjustment for Park Lighting Enhancement, to revise the scope of the project to delete the parking area lighting upgrade at Freedom Park and add the parking area lighting upgrade at the Community Center at Ira Van Bullock Park.
- Approval of the Plat for the Reserve at Summit located on the west side of Ranchette Road.
- Authorized the FY 2016 Agreement for Greenacres Youth Baseball for the use of City ball fields and facilities

Council Candidates is City-Wide regardless of the district in which you live.



## Greenacres Residents & Business Owners Burglar Alarm System

Effective February 1, 2016, the City of Greenacres will adopt the Palm Beach County Alarm Ordinance which provides that the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO) will enforce the County Alarm Ordinance within the City of Greenacres, since the City has contracted with PBSO for law enforcement services.

### How Does that Affect You?

Although the new Ordinance becomes effective February 1, 2016, the City's residents and business owners were granted a temporary reprieve because the Ordinance will require residents and business owners to register their burglar alarm systems with the PBSO Alarm Unit. *Please note that enforcement of the Alarm Ordinance will begin on May 1, 2016.*

### Why is this a big deal, and how does it affect me?

The Alarm Ordinance was created to serve two (2) primary purposes:

- to reduce unnecessary law enforcement responses to false alarm activations.
- to encourage alarm users to repair defective alarm systems and to learn how to use them properly.

This is accomplished by providing a *fine* schedule that assesses fines to users who continuously allow false alarm activations at their premises.

### How much are the fines?

The following fines are assessed under the Alarm Ordinance:

- The 1st and 2nd false alarms shall NOT be assessed fines.
- The 3rd and 4th false alarm shall each be assessed a \$50 fine.
- the 5th false alarm shall be assessed a \$75 fine.
- the 6th through 9th false alarms shall each be assessed a \$100 fine.
- The 10th and all subsequent false alarms shall each be assessed a \$500 fine.

In addition, an alarm activation from an alarm system that has not been registered is subject to a civil penalty of \$250 for each activation, so it is imperative that all residents and business owners register their alarm systems in compliance with the new Ordinance.

### How do I register my Alarm?

After February 1, 2016, you may log onto [www.pbso.org](http://www.pbso.org) then click on Alarm Application (*under sheriff's picture*) to review the Alarm Ordinance in its entirety; download an Alarm Permit Application OR you may obtain these documents at the PBSO District 16 - City of Greenacres Office at 2995 S. Jog Road, Greenacres. FL 33467. The completed application and a twenty-five dollar (\$25) check payable to PBSO should be mailed to Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office, c/o Accounting Department, P.O. Box 24681, West Palm Beach, FL 33416-4681.

After May 1, 2016, PBSO will not respond to alarms that are not properly permitted. Also, please know that all revenue received by the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office for permit applications fees, renewal fees and fines less administrative costs, are returned to the City of Greenacres. ## Greenacres Law Enforcement Services

Effective February 1, 2016, the City of Greenacres will be policed by the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO) under a contract that was signed on August 27, 2015.

Residents will continue their relationships with the existing police officers as they will continue their duties within the City as PBSO deputies. PBSO marked vehicles will patrol the City and 911 emergency calls will be answered by the Sheriff's Office. In addition, Greenacres residents will still be able to utilize the office location on Jog Road to obtain police reports, accident reports and other services offered at that location.

While this change means the end of a police department with decades of proud service, we look forward to the future and the new resources coming to serve the community.

## Greenacres Community Center Expansion Project



## Youth Athletics Leagues

The City's Youth Athletic Leagues are facilitated through the City's Leisure Services Department and the Lake Worth Sharks, Inc., and are open to children age five (5) years and over. Registration fees include player evaluations, draft, skill development, instruction, fair play, game uniform, and participation award.

Athletic Registration forms are available at the Leisure Services Department or may be obtained online, printed and submitted with payment to the Greenacres Community Center, located at 501 Swain Boulevard, Greenacres, FL 33463. First-time participants in the Youth Athletics program are required to provide the child's birth certificate at registration. Proof of residency (*i.e. utility bill*) will be required for resident discounts. City's Youth Programs Division provides year-round Afterschool and Camp Programs for Elementary through High School Students **throughout Palm Beach County**. The programs are licensed by the Palm Beach County Health Department, nationally accredited through the Council on Accreditation (COA) and have obtained the Florida Gold Seal Designation.



## C.A.R.E.S.

*Children Are Really Extra Special* - The City's year-round afterschool program for elementary school age children. Funding accepted by the Early Learning Coalition. (Open to students throughout Palm Beach County) (Palm Beach County Health Department License #50-51-00526).

- Hours of Operation: School year, 2:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m.; School holidays and Summer, 7:30 a.m. – 6:00 p.m.
- Transportation provided daily from Greenacres, Greenacres Christian, Liberty Park, Cholee Lake, Heritage, and Diamond View Elementary Schools.
- Enrichment activities include: homework assistance, S.T.E.A.M. activities, computers, athletics, music classes, cooking, gardening, cultural/civic education, art activities, field trips, movies, swimming, bowling, skating, and much more.
- A \$30 registration fee is required (*per household*) in addition to monthly program fees (*Early Learning Coalition subsidized childcare funding accepted or private pay*).

## COOL ZONE

A year-round safe, supervised, comfortable and educational environment for 6th, 7th and 8th grade students.

- Hours of Operation: School year, 4:30 p.m. – 6:00 p.m.; School holidays and Summer, 7:30 a.m. – 6:00 p.m.
- Transportation provided daily from L. C. Swain, Okeehelée, and Tradewinds Middle Schools. (*Must be a minimum of 10 children enrolled in each school for pick-up*)

Community service projects and opportunities offered throughout the year.
- Active members may take part in the Advisory Council and help plan trips and activities.
- A \$30 annual registration fee is required (*per household*).
- A \$30 monthly program fee includes snack and transportation from school.

## HOT SPOT

A year-round program for high school students 14-17 years of age to participate in the City's Mentoring Program, Youth Advisory Council, and enjoy a variety of activities.

- Activities are held at the Leisure Services Complex on the first and third Fridays or Saturdays from 6:00 p.m. – 10:00 p.m. (*excluding holidays*).
- Participants who qualify as a Youth Mentor/Counselor in Training (CIT) may attend Monday through Friday 3:30 – 6:00 p.m.
- The Hot Spot Advisory Council enables members to earn volunteer hours required for high school graduation. Advisory Council members also have an opportunity to plan and attend special field trips.
- The annual registration fee is \$30 per student.


